ABOUT Third Sector Impact

The third sector, consisting of civil society associations and foundations, volunteers, and other citizen organisations and activities, offers unique renewable and sustainable resources for social and economic problem-solving, democracy, and civic engagement in Europe. In times of social and economic distress and enormous pressures on governmental budgets this sector is an important partner in the effort to promote economic development and social cohesion in Europe.

To take full advantage of this resource we need a clearer understanding of the third sector – its scope and scale, existing and potential impacts, and barriers to full third sector contribution to the continent's common welfare. Third Sector Impact (TSI) brings together thirty researchers from 10 European universities in a comparative project, determined to address questions of third sector definition, measurement, impact assessment and ways to support its development. It includes a distinctive stakeholder engagement process to capture the insights of practitioners and include them in conceptualization, methodology and project outputs.

MEET the TSI Coordinator

Bernard Enjolras is responsible for the overall scientific and administrative management of the Third Sector Impact project. He holds a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Paris I Sorbonne (France) and a Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of Québec in Montreal (Canada). He is a Research Director and Research Professor at the Institute for Social Research (ISF). Find out more

"TSI will hopefully help putting the third sector on the policy agenda at the European and national levels. Our research aims at developing a consensual and operational definition of the third sector taking into account the cultural specificities and institutional diversity characterizing third sector organizations in Europe. We also aim at developing indicators of the sector's impact and policy proposals for the enablement of the sector's socio-economic impact. This is an exiting task which entails breaking new grounds within the third sector research field. Coordinating such a project - involving a team of top third sector scholars in twelve European countries - is a challenging responsibility but also a very rewarding endeavor."

First national stakeholder meeting in Oslo, April 9th

This first national stakeholder meeting set the stage for third sector practitioner input to the attempt to identify impact indicators on a range of a set of areas.

The Institute for Social Research (ISF) was established in 1950 as an independent foundation in Oslo, Norway.

Multidisciplinary in its orientation, it comprises research within all the social sciences and history, centred around themes as: Civil Society in Transition, Working Life, Gender Equality, Migration, Elections and Democracy, and Political institutions.

ISF took on national management of the Johns Hopkins Comparative Nonprofit Sector Research Project, carried out from 2006-2007, and the Norwegian coordination of the Network Council for "Civil Society and New Forms of Governance in Europe" (CINEFOGO), a Network of Excellence supported by EU 6th Framework Program.

ISF researchers Bernard Enjolras, Karl Henrik Sivesind and Signe Bock Segaard are in charge of the overall management and
